



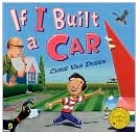

November: Transportation



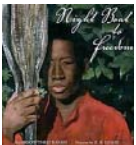
November 1 – 8, 2009

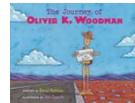
November 15 – 22
